AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE 2017 EDITION OF THE NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE AS THE MANDATORY ELECTRIC CODE FOR FAIRFIELD COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA.

WHEREAS, All local jurisdictions must adopt the mandatory building codes as required by the South Carolina State Statute 6-9-10 and 6-9-50; and

WHEREAS, The South Carolina Building Codes Council has adopted the required mandatory building codes for the State of South Carolina as authorized by South Carolina State Statute 6-9-60; and

WHEREAS, The mandatory electrical code is the 2017 edition of the National Electrical Code (NFPA 70) with SC modifications; and

WHEREAS, All local jurisdictions were to adopt the new mandatory building codes by January 1, 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY FAIRFIELD COUNTY COUNCIL THAT:


The Fairfield County Council adopts the National Electrical Code, 2017 edition, with SC modifications, as the mandatory electrical code for all design, installation, erection, alteration, addition to, replacement, workmanship, construction, maintenance or repair or installation of electrical systems, equipment and components indoors and outdoors that are within the scope of this code as defined in Article 90-2 of the 2017 National Electrical Code, including services, power distribution systems, fixtures, appliances, devices and appurtenances that are within the jurisdiction of the County of Fairfield.

THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE UPON ITS PASSAGE AND EXECUTION BY THE FAIRFIELD COUNTY COUNCIL.
